GLENS OF ANTRIM

The renowned and spectacular nine Glens of Antrim are only a few miles east of the Resort and are easily explored using the famous and unique Antrim Coast Road which runs strikingly along the coastline and passed the foot of the Glens of Antrim and the picturesque villages beside them. There are Visitor Centres in the area to explain the history and folklore of the Glens.



NORTH COAST

The North Coast, thirty miles north of the Resort, is best known for Ireland's top tourist site, the Giant's Causeway, with its unusual formations of six sided rock and wealth of local and natural history and its well known Causeway Coastal walks with breathtaking clifftop scenery and dramatic views over to Scotland. Other attractions are the famous Carrick-A-Rede Rope Bridge, and the oldest licensed whisky distiller in the world at Bushmills Distillery. Rathlin Island with its world famous RSPB bird sanctuary is a short ferry hop from Ballycastle.



GETTING AROUND

A regular train service to Belfast and to the North Coast and Londonderry runs from Cullybackey, which is within walking distance from the Resort and staff accommodation.
